Compared to Retrospect

- Problems with stability, usability and missing features cause long time users to desert Backup Exec 2012.
- Complicated to install and manage, requiring more IT resources and knowhow.
- New workflow makes backups difficult to manage: Instead of managing multiple backup sources with one job, each backup source requires a separate job, complicating schedule and resource management.
- Complicated to back up to private cloud; can't sync with various 3rd party cloud storage.
- Much more expensive.
- No GUI for Mac agent: installation and configuration requires using command line and editing configuration files.
- Doesn't offer desktop and laptop agent: Either use expensive server agent, or use two other standalone products for data file protection and system recovery (requiring separate administration and doesn't support tape).
- Backup server must run on Windows Server OS (more expensive than Windows client OS).
- Precise, point-in-time restores from incremental backups ("True Image Restore") requires \$3500 Enterprise Server Option.
- Media rotation for redundancy and offsite is complicated, or requires \$3500 add-on.
- Granular restore of files within VM or Exchange mailbox from tape requires entire VM or Exchange Information Store to be staged on disk, requiring far more disk space and time.

Compared to Retrospect

- Windows automatically defragments file system for performance, but that can significantly increase size of incremental and differential backups.
- Tape: Can't restore individual files and folders from image backups on tape. There are other tape limitations when restoring OS, verifying backup, etc.
- SQL Server: Can't truncate transaction log after backup.
- Exchange 2013: Can't restore individual mailboxes.
- Can't backup or restore individual files for Windows Server 2012 volume with Data Deduplication enabled.
- Deduplication:
 - Recommend extra hardware due to resource intensive deduplication
 - Doesn't support password protected archives
 - Doesn't support NTFS alternate data streams
- Doesn't support Mac.

Compared to Retrospect

- 2x to 4x slower than Retrospect
- Does not do 'bare metal' or full system backup or recovery.

Compared to Retrospect

- More expensive.
- Not designed for disaster recovery, particularly on Windows.
- Lacks comprehensive verification of backup set data.
- Restore unwanted files (e.g. renamed file restored as 2 instances, one before rename, one after rename) from incremental backups.
- Not designed to backup Exchange and SQL. May back up some files more than once.

Compared to Retrospect

- 2x to 4x slower than Retrospect

- Full data restores are delivered on a physical drive and can take 1 to 2 days for you to receive
- Lacks tape support.

Compared to Retrospect

- Can't verify backups on local drive.
- When backup space is low, won't prompt for additional storage and instead automatically delete backups.
- Mac only.
- Not flexible:
 - Only one set of backup settings.
 - Can't change backup schedule.
 - Not as easy as Retrospect in controlling what to backup and what to exclude.
 - No support for tape or optical device.
- No deduplication, compression or encryption.
- Can't centrally manage or report: Each user needs to manage backups on each Mac.
